 - a. School Learning Improvement plan Review
 - i. Support Student learning
 - 1. Be competitive with province with graduating class and secondary schools.
 - 2. Compare province average per class, focus on data
 - 3. Attendance goal
 - i. Everyone trying to improve
 - ii. Covid was a big drop off
 - iii. Slowly increasing since covid
 - iv. 81% attendance in grade 12 in September
 - v. Connection between attendance and grades
 - vi. Last year average attendance was 83%, above 90% was 47% of students, above 80% was 70% of students.

 - iii. Tenille great connections with a group from high school coming to JK, really positive.
 - 8. Would like Elders come in once a week to mentor and inspire
 - 9. Stacey how do you decide who gets to attend?
 - i. Dwayne some are hand pick, others volunteer
 - 1. No elder yet to come in
 - 2. HOT6 heart of treaty 6
 - 10. Jana have you asked the students to see if they are comfortable with the attention?

- Dwayne some who do not want to identify, some who want to participate in all of it and some are levels in between.
- iii. Mental Health Wellbeing Denise
 - 1. Start with staff
 - 2. Then staff walk students through
 - 3. Understanding mental health
 - 4. Staff learn how to read students better
 - i. Know what to say to them
 - ii. Have difficult conversations
 - 5. Know what is available for supports
 - 6. Learn how to self regulate
 - 7. Take information from school survey
 - i. Goal is an increase of 2% more self regulation
 - ii. Anxiety 29% identify
 - iii. Depression 30% identify
 - 8. Strategies coming from the three groups
 - 9. Teachers building connections and giving students a sense of belonging
 - 10. Define safety
 - i. Physical
 - ii. Emotional
 - iii. Street smart vs safety concern
 - iv. Monthly development with staff
 - 1. Parent engagement as well
 - v. This is not a sprint, but a marathon
 - vi. Building from the roots up (tree)
 - 11. Educate parents and students on specific mental health issues
 - 12. Jana when a teacher is threatened / cussed out / how do they manage?
 - i. Denise they come to administration
 - ii. Jana what does administration do for mental health?
 - iii. Denise based on climate and environment, students accountable, high standards in classroom
 - iv. Jana is it pushed to parents
 - v. Denise yes
 - vi. Dwayne each teacher has a different threshold.
 Usually a first offense is handled by the teacher
 with a private conversation after that administration
 would hope they would come to them, but that is
 not always the case. Administrators want to protect
 teachers and the learning environment

- 13. Matt there is nothing mentioned about using physical wellness for mental health
 - i. Jana would like to see that too
- 14. Dwayne 50% of students drop PE in grade 11 when it is no longer a mandatory class and many did not like being forced to take it.
 - i. Jana some kids drop out because they need academic classes and just can not fit it in
 - ii. Matt maybe do it on the side or on their own, not in a class setting
 - iii. Dwayne Synergy gym hoping to have it open in the evenings for the equipment to get used, but have not worked out the details yet.
 - iv. Doug it is open times during the day for drop in with supervision
 - v. Dwayne we will add in the importance of physical activity daily

- 2. Get grade nines to start thinking about graduation
 - i. Plan course for graduation
 - ii. Grade blueprint
