- → Prerequisite a course that must be completed successfully prior to continuing on to the next level. ie. Science 10 is a prerequisite for Computer Science 20, Environmental Science 20, Physical Science 20 and Health Science 20.
- → Compulsory/Core Course Course you must take in order to graduate.
 - In grade 10 there are 5 compulsory courses:
 - ELA 10, History or Native Studies 10, Math 10, Science 10 and Financial Literacy
 - Many students take Wellness 10 as a Physical Education course - you need one Phys. Ed. class to graduate
- → You must receive 50% in order to pass a class. If you do not pass, you MUST take the course over.

Elective Course - These are courses you can take for personal interest or career preparation. Could be Practical & Applied Arts courses, Fine Arts courses, Computer courses, or core science/math courses.


Comprehensive Finals - Just what it says ... final exam that covers all of the material for the semester

- → Grade 10 Students must be registered in 10 subjects, 5 each semester, excluding Drivers Ed.
- → The only difference between grade 9 and grade 10 schedules is that you will stay in the same 5 classes in the first semester and then switch to a new 5 classes in semester 2. Every class has a different teacher and different group of students!
- Dropping and changing elective classes is not an option!



Graduation Requirements

GRADE 10

Minimum 8 credits - we ask you to sign up for 10 classes (no spares)

Compulsory grade 10 courses:

- ELA 10
- History 10 or Native Studies 10
- Science 10
- 1 Math: Foundations and Pre Calc 10 or Workplace and Apprenticeship 10
- Financial Literacy 10
- 3-4 electives at level 10 or higher.
- Note: need a Wellness/Phys Ed. credit to grad Wellness 10





Making informed decisions when choosing courses:

- → Use course selection booklet and elective videos
- → Have conversations with your teachers and parents
- → Consider your areas of strengths and interests
- → Start thinking about possible careers
- → Grade 10 is a base year with many compulsory courses and 3 4 electives
 - Look at prerequisites (example: you need to take PAA Industrial Arts 10 to get into Welding, Mech. Auto, and Machining in grade 11)
- Grade 10's should not require future timetable changes, so choose wisely!

Football 10, 20, 30

- <u>Football 10</u>: This introductory course familiarizes students with the fundamental concepts of football, covering tackle, touch, and flag variations. Participants will develop individual and team skills while enhancing their fitness, mental training, and leadership abilities. The curriculum emphasizes basic training, conditioning, nutrition, mental wellness, game strategies, goal setting, communication, and sportsmanship.
- <u>Football 20</u>: This intermediate football course. It will delve deeper into the rules, game strategies, skills, and leadership roles within a team context. There is an increased emphasis on physical conditioning, mental training, and intermediate football concepts.
- <u>Football 30:</u> This an advanced course which engages students in complex football concepts. The curriculum covers game strategy planning, in-game decision-making, physical fitness, advanced tactics, leadership, goal setting, community partnerships, and secondary careers related to football.

- Fees may apply depending on activities



Grade 10 Athletic Pathway



Drivers Ed.

- → A non Credit Course students only get one opportunity
- → Offered during Early Bird or Noon Hour
- → 30 hours of classroom instruction
- → 6 hours in car driving
- → After 3 missed classes you will be removed
- → AB students course not required, however, by having the course you may pay reduced insurance rates in Alberta if you can demonstrate successful completion of the course. AB students are required to have their learner's license before beginning the Driver's Education Course.
- → Sask. students required to complete this course to be eligible for a Saskatchewan Class 5 Driver's license. Please enroll in Early Bird OR Noon Driver's Ed. Must apply for a SGI customer number with 2 pieces of ID before starting the course. You can apply at any SGI office.


