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Registration for Next

Course selections should be based on the following criteria:

- → Your life and career interests
- → Gaining experience in those interest areas
- → Specific post-secondary institution admission requirements

You should plan for your first choice and also develop a solid backup plan

Grade Level Requirements

- → Ensure you have completed all required courses for grade 10 and/or 11(Refer to specific requirements on page 6 of the course description book [electronic copy on LCHS home page])
- → Students are responsible for ensuring they have the correct prerequisites and credits
- → 24 credits are required for a Saskatchewan High School Diploma.
- → Student Services requires all students to enroll in enough courses to graduate with 25 credits
- → Must have 2 PAA or Arts credits at any grade level in order to graduate.
- → Students wishing to receive honors or distinction must have seven 20 level credits including a math and science.





Environmental Science 20


Looking at environmental policies and ethics, environmental action plans, local and global environmental issues.

Health Science 20


Body systems and medical field knowledge

- You must sign up for 7 20 level classes for honours and distinction




Athletic Pathway

- Available for grade 11 students in the 2025/2026 school year
- By application only
- Pathway includes a cost to families
- You will be cohorted all year in athletic based courses
- In grade 11, you will receive Physical Education 20, High Performance/Sports Psychology 20, and Active Living/Fitness Leader 20 (3 elective courses)

The athlete development pathway at LCHS provides student-athletes with advanced technical, theoretical, and experiential opportunities to grow as an athlete and individuals. The athlete development pathway aims to develop and support single and multisport athletes to achieve their athletic goals while striving for academic excellence in an integrated high school setting.

New Courses

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Football 10, 20, 30

- Football 10: This introductory course familiarizes students with the fundamental concepts of football, covering tackle, touch, and flag variations. Participants will develop individual and team skills while enhancing their fitness, mental training, and leadership abilities. The curriculum emphasizes basic training, conditioning, nutrition, mental wellness, game strategies, goal setting, communication, and sportsmanship.
- Football 20: This intermediate football course. It will delve deeper into the rules, game strategies, skills, and leadership roles within a team context. There is an increased emphasis on physical conditioning, mental training, and intermediate football concepts.
- Football 30: This an advanced course which engages students in complex football concepts. The curriculum covers game strategy planning, in-game decision-making, physical fitness, advanced tactics, leadership, goal setting, community partnerships, and secondary careers related to football.
