## Terminology

- 10, 20, 30 Grade 10 courses, Grade 11 Courses, Grade 12 Courses
- 11, 21 and 31- modified programming
- 18, 28 and 38- alternate programming

### •CREDIT:

•What you earn for passing a 100 hour high school course in Saskatchewan.

•Need 24 to graduate.

•Most students get 28 or more.

### •SEMESTER:

•This means you write final exams in January & June!

# **Terminology Continues**

•BLOCK - Same as a period. •8 Blocks each day •Plock 1 is also called "Early Bird" Sta

•Block 1 is also called "Early Bird" – Starts @ 7:50 a.m. (Dr. Ed. Could be here)

•Block 5 is lunch hour. (Dr. Ed. Could be here) (Jazz Band also uses this block)

•Block 8 is after school and is only used for Jazz Band (Yah! You get a credit for Jazz band!)

•Regular day is Block 2, 3, 4 before lunch & Block 6 & 7 after lunch

### **Terminology Continued**

Pre-requisite – a course that must be completed successfully prior to continuing on to the next level. ie. Science 10 is a pre-requisite for Environmental Science 20, Physical Science 20 and Health Science 20. You must receive 50% in order to pass a class. If you do not pass, you MUST take the course over.

### Compulsory/Core Course

- Course you must take in order to graduate.
- In grade 10 there are 5 compulsory courses ELA A10, ELA B10, History or Native Studies 10, Math 10, Science 10
- Many students take Wellness 10 as a Physical Education course is compulsory during high school.

# **Terminology Continued**

### • Elective Course

- These are courses you can take for personal interest or career preparation.
- Could be Practical & Applied Arts courses, Fine Arts courses, Computer courses, or core science/math courses.

### • Comprehensive Finals

Just what it says ... final exam that covers all of the material for the semester ... worth 20 - 30% of your final grade.

### **Terminology continued...**

- Tutorial supervised study hall, including lunch hour.
- Grade 10 Students- must be registered in 10 subjects, 5 each semester, excluding driver ed.
- Dropping and changing elective classes is not an option!

  - AB students... not required, however, by having the course you may pay reduced insurance rates in Alberta if you can demonstrate successful completion of the course. AB students are required to have their learner's license before beginning the Driver's Education Course.
  - Sask. students... required to complete this course to be eligible for a Saskatchewan Class 5 Driver's license. Please enroll in semester 1 Driver's Ed.
